

Our new educational video and handbook on the Inter-American human rights system are now online!

Updated to include recent reforms and developments, these resources are also now available in English, Spanish, Portuguese, and Haitian Creole.

Visit IJRC's page on the Inter-American System to view or download the **5-part video** - including interviews with human rights practitioners - and the **legal manual** explaining the ways in which the Inter-American Commission on Human Rights and Inter-American Court of Human Rights promote and protect fundamental freedoms in the Americas. Nations Special Rapporteur on Torture and former Judge of the Human Rights Chamber for Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Mr. Nowak explains the value of special procedures and civil society in protecting human rights, and the responsiveness of governments to working with special procedures. He also shares advice for advocates bringing forth cases of alleged human rights violations, and remarks upon the importance of human rights defenders on the ground.


